## ***NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND*** **School and District Report Cards** **2010-11**

The federal *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001* (NCLB) requires states and school districts to provide an Annual Report Card to parents and the community. These report cards contain assessment and accountability data in the areas of reading, mathematics and science. Progress is measured at both the whole school level and for specific sub-groups. Information is also provided on Highly Qualified Teachers (HQT) and the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). These documents provide a snapshot of our current status toward achieving standards and meeting the goals of NCLB.

The final component of the NCLB Annual Report Card is Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP). NCLB requires schools to meet higher targets or benchmarks each year in order to attain AYP. In addition, these targets must be met by the full student population that is tested and by each sub-group. If one of these groups does not meet the target, the entire school does not make AYP. According to the federal requirements, it should be noted that the number of Maine schools across the state making adequate yearly progress has been decreasing. By the 2013-2014 NCLB testing year, 100% of students as a whole group and in all subgroups must be proficient in both reading and mathematics for a school to be designated as making adequate yearly progress.

### WOCSD Data Summary

- All three schools exceeded the Average Daily Attendance Target of 92%.
- Wells High School exceeded the Graduation Rate Target of 80% with a graduation rate of 87%.
- 99.36% of staff is Highly Qualified according to the NCLB requirements.
- Both Wells Junior High School and Wells High School missed overall AYP status due to one sub-group that did not make the target goals in reading and math.
- The overall AYP status of Wells Elementary School is *Monitor* due to one sub-group that did not make the target goal in math.

- The MEA Science Assessment is administered to grades 5, 8 and 11. All three grade levels exceeded the state average level of proficiency:
  - Gr. 5 - 68%     State – 55%
  - Gr. 8 - 69%     State – 62%
  - Gr. 11 - 48%     State – 41%
  
- In the area of Reading, all three schools exceeded the state average level of proficiency:
  - WES – 84%     State – 71%
  - WJHS -84%     State – 71%
  - WHS - 56%     State – 47%
  
- In the area of Mathematics, all three schools exceeded the state average level of proficiency:
  - WES – 81%     State – 63%
  - WJHS -79%     State – 63%
  - WHS – 63%     State - 45%
